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Learning choice academy

You're looking to get your Livescan fingerprints taken? TLC does Livescan through the San Diego County Office of Education (SDCOE), but you'll need to make an appointment and pay for the service using their required form. If you've already done Livescan with another school or business, yes, you still need to do it again for TLC, as results are confidential records protected by law. If you're a business with questions about vendor process or policies, email extendedunits@learningchoice.org. To advertise your classes to TLC students, use PeachJar for electronic flyer distribution and submit a brief announcement to events@learningchoice.org. TLC will also publish an approved vendor list to all families in their weekly bulletin/newsletter. As a vendor, you'll need to submit a business license, proof of liability insurance (with The Learning Choice Academy as an additional insured), and if your business has employees, proof of worker's compensation insurance naming The Learning Choice Academy as a certificate holder. Once approved, you'll be notified by email with added vendor contact information and class description on their approved list. The school funding is tied to student participation in state testing, so it's crucial for students to participate fully. Test results can also help evaluate the effectiveness of your curriculum. If you're unsure how to read the summary of your student's scores on the SBAC (state testing), consult with your Educational Partner, who can assist with ordering curriculum or identifying objectives. Remember to separate business and personal activities to maintain confidentiality and follow all required procedures for a successful vendor partnership. The role of assessing student learning styles and instructional strategies can be simplified using online tools. A website (offers quizzes to identify individual learning preferences. However, high school credit for volunteer work requires affiliation with an established non-profit organization. To address academic questions, the Educational Program (EP) is a starting point. Additionally, the TLC guidance counselor provides on-site meetings and weekly conferences by appointment (www.learningchoice.org or samantha.peterson@learningchoice.org). Regarding textbooks for concurrent enrollment classes, TLC policy does not cover book costs due to copyright concerns and limited budget availability. This affects students' ability to resell their books or use them in their future studies. For a more balanced educational approach, the Hybrid Program combines on-campus instruction with at-home learning. Choice programs prioritize individualized care and support, fostering strong relationships between staff and clients. A sector leader in social care, Choice Care Academy offers 24-hour support to its clients through fully-trained workers. The company is committed to delivering the best-in-class care by providing training and development programs for staff on an ongoing basis. This includes frontline skills, management training, and specialized courses tailored to individual needs. Colleagues praise the organization's dedication to supporting their growth and well-being. Parents and students agree that there are many clubs and organizations available at the Learning Choice Academy, which allows students to get involved and participate in various activities. However, some parents express concerns about the consistency of classes and the lack of communication between teachers and students with special needs. They also mention that the school's staff does not always provide adequate support for students on the spectrum. On the other hand, many students and parents have had positive experiences at the Learning Choice Academy, praising its small class sizes, caring teachers, and accommodating administration. The school offers various extracurricular activities, including plays, whodunnits, and zoo trips, which involve both students and their families. Some reviewers mention that while the school excels in certain areas, there are some limitations, such as a lack of optional classes at the middle school level and limited sports teams. However, the school is planning to start new sports teams, which will provide more opportunities for students to participate in athletics. The Learning Choice Academy - East County has received positive ratings from Niche, with 27% of students scoring proficient in math and 52% in reading. The school has a student-teacher ratio of 17:1 and offers various clubs and activities for its 407 students in grades K-12.
