This makes learning more engaging and helps students retain information better than just looking at a list of vocab words. Collect items related to your lessons and find a way to store them neatly. Use visual aids such as word walls and posters to introduce and reinforce new vocabulary, making it easier for students to recognize and read unfamiliar words. You can also make learning more interactive by having students work in pairs or as a class with a PowerPoint presentation featuring images and text.

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
