The covered car park comes in handy during rains because an enclosed path from the car park leads to the Singapore Zoos entrance. Cost of parking The first ten minutes are free. When you pay by cash card, the first hour costs $$3, after which every additional hour costs $$2. The maximum parking charges for a car get capped at $$10. If you are

Singapore Zoo and Night Safari in one day. We came here on an overcast but warm morning with only a 50% chance of rain. On arrival this was 100% and it was raining. Not to fret, the Zoo gift shop has a variety of umbrellas and ponchos for sale if like us, you did not bring any. Firstly, the landscaping is lovely & so is the location. It is a large zoo

However, this was fully booked on site and then there were not even many visitors the day we were there. So if you want to feed the animals order it online! However, you could get very close and
watch as other visitors fed the animals. There were also two "shows" at an amphitheater. One was a sea lion in the center and the other was everything from birds, monkeys to small mammals. Again here it was clear that they had taught the animals with "carrot" rather than "stick."We enjoyed the half-day we spent at the zoo, and certainly could have
spent longer here, but we'd already done a lot of walking and needed to rest our legs! On that front, the free shuttles, which do a loop around the zoo, are much appreciated. There's a huge variety of animals to see. The walk-in butterfly and wildlife enclosure was the absolute highlight for us. Some of the exhibits are looking a little run-down, and
most of the eateries were closed when we were there (a quiet Monday afternoon), but generally we had a lovely time. Given the zoo is in the north of the island and not connected to the city by metro, we opted to get a Grab ride there and back to avoid the kerfuffle of navigating the public transport options. This added a fair bit to the cost, but was
very convenient. Excellent attraction deserving of a full dedicated day of time. Try to go early before it gets too hot and plan to take the team to get from exhibit to exhibit to conserve energy especially with young kids. Also, definitely sign up for the feeding of the animals which is an extra charge. The best part is that every dollar you spend here goes
towards supporting the important conservation work that the zoo is doing throughout Southeast Asia. Definitely a must see when in Singapore.Did the 2 park package, zoo and night safari. Reservations are required, but first, take photos with the animals that appear in half-hour shifts while eating at the buffet restaurant.
You can also experience feeding elephants, zebras and giraffes.(Only zebras are dangerous, so children are not allowed alone.) You can feel a sense of space and dynamism not found in zoos in Japan, and you can feel moving lions, monkeys and orangutans as they are naturally. There is also a free tour bus, so it is comfortable to spread out. I went on a
Saturday, and was worried it would be crowded, but it wasn't too bad. Hard to have a bad day wandering about, spotting and photographing some the world's incredibly diverse wildlife. Just as well, given the admission fee isn't cheap. However, like all zoos, it's a bit of a lottery, so, while the malaysian tigers were highly visible and active, the lions
were just a blur in the distance. Perhaps the highlight was the impressive collection of monkeys the zoo has, from all over the world. Also, I have long wanted to see a komodo dragon, so was able to tick that off. A previous reviewer has noted that the elephants enclosure was small and depressing, and I would have to agree with this. The giraffe
enclosure also left something to be desired. But these were exceptions. As far as I could tell most of the animals looked healthy and well looked after. Some other reviewers have written, it's best to arrive early to beat the heat, and crowds. Although, given that this is Singapore, it's still going to be fairly warm whatever time you get there. I walked
everywhere, and was thus able to avoid the queue for the free trams on offer. And I didn't find the zoo too spread out, or the walking too difficult for this to be a problem. If you are not very fit of mobile, or have young children, than obviously the trams are the way to go, but otherwise I would suggest giving walking a shot. The structure is very large

We took a taxi from our hotel in Singapore, which was an easy 25-ish minute ride. We arrived shortly after opening on a weekday and found the zoo to be nice and quiet. The exhibits are very
well done, allowing for great viewing. Many animals seemed closer than we've seen at other zoos. The baboon exhibit was my favorite. My only tip to others is to research the facility beforehand. Based on reviews, I thought there was just an admission
ticket. Perhaps we missed something, but we still had an excellent experience. No animal encounters needed at this excellent zoo. We spent a few hours wandering around and eating lunch, then grabbed a taxi back to Singapore. We only went to the zoo so my daughter could see a sloth but we saw so much more! Most of the other animals are just the
same as at any zoo around the world and we weren't expecting much as we have been to plenty of other zoos. We were pleasantly surprised. The free train is a nice touch, especially in the heat and the zoo seems to go round in circles with not much helpful signage. We missed several things due to the confusing layout. There are several options for
food, and a large outdoor seating area, accessible by the train. The reptiles were cool and being from Australia, it was fun to see some blue-tongue lizards being active and feeding. It was good to be able to get closer to some of the mithout fences in the way (they are still enclosed, but kept away from people with
moats rather than big fences, so you can see a lot more of the animals). We stumbled across the opportunity to feed the Arapaima fish which was super amazing and fun! Having the orangutans hanging above us and swinging on their rope was a great experience. Walking through the Fragile Forest was awesome - you are among the wildlife and can
get up close with all kinds of birds and lemurs. It was here we saw the sloth we had been longing for! Hidden in a tree and not as close as we'd hoped but still gorgeous! If you only have limited time, then skip the zoo. But if you have a day to spare, it is a fun day out. Pity about so many closures. We recently visited the Singapore Zoo, and while it was
still a good day out, there were a few things that took away from the experience. Firstly, a large portion of the zoo is currently under construction noise was genuinely unpleasant and made it hard to enjoy the beginning of the visit. Many of the shows were
not operational. I wish there had been more transparency about this when booking. One thing I really didnt love is how the park has split up the experiences. For example, if you want to see the pandas, you need to purchase a separate River Wonders ticket. It feels a little like a money grab, especially for families trying to see it all in one day. That said,
theres still a lot to enjoy. The kids play area is good a great space for little ones to burn off steam though, as with most attractions, food and drink are eye-wateringly overpriced. Bring your own water bottles there are refill fountains around the
park and saves a lot of walking, especially in the heat. We noticed Stops 1, 2, and 3 often had long queues, but Stop 4 (near the kids play area and KFC) was much quieter and never had a wait. We paid 157 euros for 4 adults and a
child. Disappointing Visit, awful food options Sadly this was perhaps the most disappointing of our experiences in Singapore. There are a lot of works occurring which look like this will be a terrific resort in the future but the works are impacting the experiences for visiting now. The noise of drilling in the entrance is unbearable, I feel for the people
working in the amenities there. No complaints about the animals, they are always great but we werent allowed to see the elephants, we were told that we couldnt enter when we walked around to see them. Tried to get some food intolerances the Ah Meng restaurant and bistro, very disappointing in the restaurant, looked like all made up meals and not
