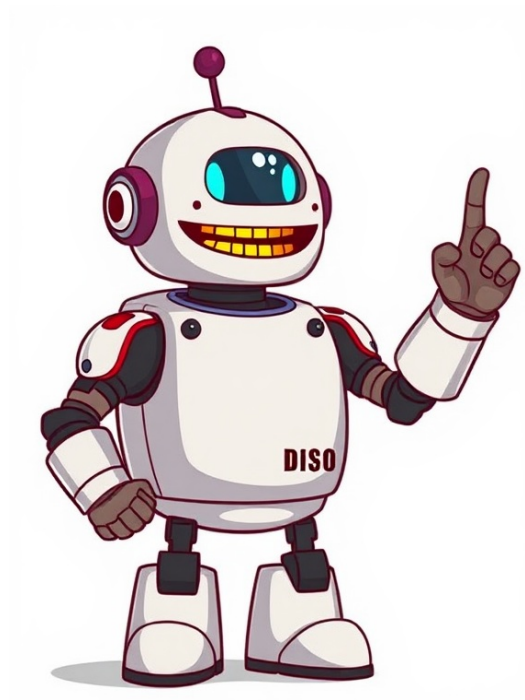

Save as PDF Not Working in Adobe Acrobat Reader: Troubleshooting MethodsAdobe Acrobat Reader is a widely used tool for opening, viewing, reading, editing, printing, encrypting, converting, and managing PDFs. However, it sometimes runs into various problems, such as unable to start correctly, unable to open PDFs, blank page PDFs, and the "Save as PDF" not working issue. Many users have reported a problem where they cannot save PDF after editing in Adobe Acrobat Reader or web browsers. The issue can be caused by certain settings, outdated versions, read-only/in-used files, or temporary glitches. To fix this issue, you need to follow these troubleshooting methods:Firstly, try restarting your computer and Adobe Reader to clear temporary glitches. Also, you can try running Adobe Acrobat Reader with admin rights.Sometimes a bug in the outdated reader can cause you cannot save PDF files. So, make sure the Adobe Acrobat Reader is updated to the latest version. To update Adobe Reader, click the Menu icon from the upper left corner, select Help, then click on Check for updates. If any updates are available here, install them and check if the PDF wont save issue disappears.Another reason for this problem could be the storage settings in Adobe Reader. To fix that, you can disable the "show online storage when saving files" option via the guide below:Step 1: Open the PDF file that you can't save with Adobe Acrobat.Step 2: Navigate to the Edit tab and select Preferences.Step 3: Select General from the left options and make sure to untick the box of Show online storage when saving files from the right panel.Step 4. Click on OK to save the change. After that, restart Adobe Reader and see if the Save as PDF not working problem gets solved.Some other people found that the Save as PDF not working issue can be fixed by changing the display settings in Adobe. It may seem strange but worth trying. To do so, open the Preferences window like Step 1 in the above solution, select Internet from the left panel, and then untick the box of Allow fast web view from the right side and click on OK.If you still can't save as PDF on Windows, you may consider using an Adobe Acrobat Reader alternative. MiniTool PDF Editor is a tool that holds almost all the basic features of Adobe Reader, including "edit, view, create, read, convert, compress, print, encrypt PDFs, etc." To save as PDF on MiniTool PDF Editor, you can open the file and press Ctrl + Shift + S to save the PDF after editing or making some changes.Still there, but part of it is gone. For other documents, the middle of the PDF will still have the highlighting and markups, but the earlier and later parts of the PDF will be missing the highlighting and markups. I highlight and markup these PDFs in order from first page to last page, so if this were a mere issue of the document not saving correctly, then one would expect that the earlier parts/pages would retain the highlighting and markups, and everything after that point would lose them.
