You must be at least 18 years of age to apply for a NC driver's license. You must be at least 15 years old to obtain a NC Limited Learner Permit or Provisional License. Everyone who operates a motor vehicle on streets and highways in North Carolina. Yes. You must pass the vision, knowledge, traffic signs and road tests. Yes. You will need to wear your corrective lenses every time you drive, and this restriction will be indicated on your driver license. If you are at least 15 years old but younger than 18 years of age, you can enter the Graduated Licensing Program and apply for a Limited Learner Permit or a Provisional License. No, a parent or legal guardian must give his/her consent. Every resident who is at least 15 years old, has completed an approved driver education course and can provide a Driving Eligibility Certificate. Be at least 15 years old; Successfully complete a 30 hours classroom instruction and 6 hours behind-the-wheel instruction; Pass the written, signs and vision tests. During the first 6 months, you are allowed to drive only between 5 am and 9 pm if accompanied by your supervising driver. After the first 6 months, you can drive anytime if accompanied by your supervising driver. A parent, grandparent, guardian or a responsible person approved by the parent/guardian. After 12 months, you can apply for a Limited Provisional License. You must be at least 16 years old. You must also complete at least 60 hours of supervised driving and have no convictions of motor vehicle moving violations. You are allowed to drive alone only from 5 am to 9 pm. The number of passengers (other than family members) under the age of 21 is limited to 1 if the supervising driver is not riding in the car; You are not allowed to use a mobile phone. Hold your Limited Provisional License for at least 6 months; Complete at least 12 hours of supervised operation (including at least 6 hours during nighttime); Avoid any conviction of motor vehicle moving violation. If you are under 18 years of age, you are not allowed to use a mobile phone. Contact your local driver license office. Find your nearest office at . The knowledge test contains 25 questions. To pass the North Carolina DMV test, you are allowed to miss 3 of the 12 questions about road signs, and 5 of the 25 questions about road rules. Drivers over the age of 18 don't have to get a learner's permit, license fees are only \$5 and applicants can take three passes at the test, which requires 80 percent proficiency.How many questions are on the drivers test? 46 questions The learner's permit test consists of 25 multiple choice questions. To receive a passing grade on the examination you must correctly answer twenty out of twenty-five questions. In order to apply for your permit, the State of North Carolina requires that you provide the following documents: Proof of identitySocial Security cardProof of residenceProof of citizenship or legal presenceProof of completion of driver's ed (Driving Eligibility Certificate)Necessary fees (\$15 for a Level 1 limited learner's permit, as of this writing)A parent or guardian's signatureWhen you submit your application for your permit, you have ninety days or three attempts to successfully complete the written test. If you fail the test within ninety days you are allowed to retake it two more times, though usually you have to wait one day between attempts and you may be charged a reexamination fee each time. If you fail the test three times or wait longer than ninety days to retake it, then the application will be closed and you'll have to repeat the process from the beginning.In general, obtaining a learner's permit is not a difficult process. Students who have studied the North Carolina Driver's Handbook in its entirety rarely have any problem passing the test, and for extra assurance an excellent idea is take one or more of the free practice tests that are available online. All of the questions that appear on the learner's permit test are found in the North Carolina Driver's Handbook, which is also available for free download from the North Carolina DOT website.
