Entries in the works-cited list are created using the MLA template of core elements—facts common to most sources, like author, title, and publication date. To use the template, evaluate the work you're citing to see which elements apply to the source. Then, list each element relevant to your source in the order given on the template. Skip to content menu search Search for posts, topics, or tags. Each entry in the list of works cited is composed of facts common to most works—the MLA core elements. They are assembled in a specific order. Containers The concept of containers is crucial to MLA style. When the source being documented forms part of a larger whole, the larger whole can be thought of as a container that holds the source. For example, a short story may be contained in an anthology. The short story is the source, and the anthology is the container. Practice Template Learn how to use the MLA practice template to create entries in the list of works cited. The Federal Register maintained by the National Archives publishes digital copies of executive orders by US presidents dating back to President Franklin Roosevelt. To cite a presidential executive order, go to its web page on the Federal Register. The works-cited-list entry begins with the name of the president and includes the title of the order, the date the order was published in the register, the title of the website, and the URL. The following provides examples of in-text citations and works-cited-list entries for executive orders: A recent executive order on water pressure notes that "the Oxford English Dictionary defines 'showerhead' in one short sentence" (Trump, "Maintaining"). Another establishes a government office to encourage "domestic and foreign investment in the United States" ("Establishing"). Works Cited Trump, Donald.
